How to introduce yourselves to the class

- On the first day, each participant will introduce her/himself to the class in **10 minutes**: not only name, area of study and home country, but also her/his previous education, and what she/he expects from the summer CSR school;
- You may use the style you prefer: a slide presentation or an introduction without slides. Every style is welcome (also song, poem, play music), as it is a school of communication, rather than a scientific meeting or a job interview.

For practice on written and oral communication in class

- It should be useful to bring at the CSR school examples of written and oral works made by the participants;
- examples of written compositions: poster, abstract, scientific paper, or the table of contents of Master/PhD thesis. It should be better to have this material in paper, especially poster, as we will post them in class.
- examples of oral compositions: slide presentation for scientific meetings, report of the final year (for PhD students), or slide presentation of Master/PhD defence.

Logistic information

Travelling to/from Italy

Due to Covid-19 pandemic dispositions, the participants should carefully read the information for travellers from UE and non-UE countries, which are available on the Italian Ministry of Health website:

Registration

Registration fee: € 500 by July 15, 2021

The registration fee does not include:

- accommodation and meals
- health insurance, if necessary
- payment for visa, if necessary
- any other additional costs.

Please, make sure that you are covered by your current medical insurance policy or that you have purchased a traveller policy which is valid also in Italy, if in your country you have one.

CSR grants for the participants

- Since 2020, a “CSR fund” has been established, which intends to favourite the participation of young researchers to the summer CSR school. The fund has been ideated by several Italian CSR alumni who wish to help their peers to have access to the CSR training;

- this year the “CSR fund” offers **two grants of € 150 each** which are addressed to highly motivated young researchers who cannot cover the whole cost of the CSR school. Priority will be given to those ones who live in the Mediterranean area (especially the Balkans, Maghreb and the Middle East), as well as to the young researchers who live in Central and Southern Africa, and in Central and Southern America;

- for applying to the CSR grant send your CV with a cover letter, by indicating the reasons for joining the CSR school 2021, your interests and expectations on this kind of training. Applications should be addressed to: info@comunicazionericercascientifica.it

The deadline for applications is June 20, 2021.

The applicants will be informed by June 25, 2021.

Cancellation policy

In case of cancellation, the registration fee is usually not refunded. Nevertheless, if the cancellation is due to Covid-19 infection, the registration fee will be refunded.

Accommodation and meals

Accommodation

Nazareth Residence (B&B hospitality). The website is at the moment only in Italian: (<http://www.nazarethresidence.com/>).

Accommodation will be available from Monday, August 2, to Friday, August 6, 2021.

The Residence has single rooms with private bathroom for each guest. The price per one night includes breakfast and it is 35-40 €.

The accommodation will be paid at the check-in in euro.

Check-in: Monday, August 2 no later than 7 p.m.

Check-out: Friday, August 6, before 10.30 a.m.

Meals

All the participants will dine together in the surroundings of the Residence and the city center. The price of an average meal varies from €10 to 30€.

How to reach Viterbo (Nazareth Residence)

From Fiumicino Airport (Rome)

- The quickest way to get Viterbo from Fiumicino Airport is to reach the Rome city centre using Trenitalia railway services (<https://www.trenitalia.com/en.html>).
- From the railway station, located inside the airport area close to the arrival and departure terminals, you can reach the city centre using the FL1 regional line trains from/to Rome stations. There are departures every 15 minutes on working days and every 30 minutes on weekends and holidays.
- From Fiumicino Airport you have to get off at Trastevere and take the local train for Viterbo, which takes about 1 hour and half (every hour on weekdays).
You have to get off at Viterbo, Porta Romana
- Nazareth Residence is reachable in about ten minutes walking.

By train from Rome

- If you travel from other Italian towns, the quickest way is still to reach Rome (Termini or Tiburtina), and then take the local train to Viterbo;
- from Rome Termini station take the line A metro and get off at Valle Aurelia or the line B metro and get off at Ostiense. Take the local train Roma Ostiense to Viterbo, Porta Romana (every hour on weekdays);
- from Rome Tiburtina station, take the line B metro and get off at Ostiense. Take the local train Roma Ostiense to Viterbo, Porta Romana (every hour on weekdays).
